Mary journeys, Mary encounters, Mary rejoices.

[An extract from a reflection of Today's Gospel by Pope Francis]

Mary journeys from Nazareth to the house of Zechariah and Elizabeth. It is the first of Mary's journeys, as related by the Scriptures. The first of many. She will journey from Galilee to Bethlehem, where Jesus will be born; she will go down to Egypt to save her Child from Herod; she will go up again every year to Jerusalem for the Passover (cf. Lk 2:31), and ultimately, she will follow Jesus to Calvary. These journeys all have one thing in common: they were never easy; they always required courage and patience... She is our sister at every step of the way. She knows what it is to be weary of walking and she can take us by the hand amid our difficulties, in the most perilous twists and turns in our life's journey.

Mary encounters Elizabeth (cf. Lk 1:39-56), a woman already advanced in years (v. 7). But Elizabeth, though older, is the one who speaks of the future and, "filled with the Holy Spirit" (v. 41), prophesies in words that foreshadow the last of the Gospel beatitudes: "Blessed are those who believe" (cf. Jn 20:29). Remarkably, the younger woman goes to meet the older one, seeking her roots, while the older woman is reborn and prophetically foretells the future of the younger one. Here, young and old meet, embrace and awaken the best of each. It is a miracle brought about by the culture of encounter, where no one is discarded or pigeonholed, but all are sought out, because all are needed to reveal the Lord's face... Mary, as she journeys to visit Elizabeth, reminds us where God desired to dwell and live, where his sanctuary is, and where we can feel his heartbeat: it is in the midst of his People...

<u>Mary rejoices</u> because she bears in her womb Emmanuel, God-with-us: "The Christian life is joy in the Holy Spirit" (<u>Gaudete et Exsultate</u>, 122). Without joy, we remain paralyzed, slaves to our unhappiness. Often problems of faith have little to do with a shortage of means and structures, of quantity, or even the presence of those who do not accept us; they really have to do with a shortage of joy. Faith wavers when it just floats along in sadness and discouragement. When we live in mistrust, closed in on ourselves, we contradict the faith. Instead of realizing that we are God's children for whom he does great things (cf. v. 49), we reduce everything to our own problems... In our sadness, we forget that we are not orphans, for we have a Father in our midst, a powerful saviour. Mary comes to our aid, because instead of reducing things, she magnifies them in "magnifying" the Lord, in praising his greatness.

Here we find the secret of our joy. Mary, lowly and humble, starts from God's greatness and despite her problems - which were not few - she is filled with joy, for she entrusts herself to the Lord in all things. She reminds us that God can always work wonders if we open our hearts to him and to our brothers and sisters.

It will be possible to participate, in real time and on demand, in the main events of the 2025 Jubilee, immersing oneself in a true spiritual journey enriched with educational, cultural, and historical content.

From the opening of the Holy Doors, beginning with the one in St. Peter's Basilica, to the conclusion of the Holy Year, Vatican News programming on YouTube will be varied and engaging.

Audio and video content will be designed to encourage viewers to discover the main themes of the Holy Year, offering food for thought, stories of faith, and testimonies of pilgrimages from all over the world.

CARITAS AUSTRALIA LAUNCHES VANUATU Earthquake Appeal

At least 14 people have been killed in Vanuatu following two earthquakes in 24 hours, impacting an estimated 116,000 people. Hundreds of people are injured or trapped following the collapse of buildings resulting from successive 7.4 and 6.1 magnitude earthquakes. As rescue efforts continue, the death toll is expected to rise. The Port Vila hospital has been overwhelmed, having also sustained damage resulting in the closure of operating theatres. Two major water reserves that supply Port Vila have also been destroyed. Major damage to infrastructure has been sustained, impacting communications, airport runways and bridges. As part of the Church Agencies Network Disaster Operations (CANDO) Caritas Australia will be supporting on the ground through its partners. These partners are assessing the situation, and are ready to respond to the humanitarian requirements, which are likely to include emergency shelter, food and other essentials, as well as psychosocial support.

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP COMENSOLI

Over recent weeks, much attention has been drawn to the window displays in the heart of Melbourne's CBD. These displays have sparked conversations about their social history and the tradition they represent for families. At the same time, they've prompted reflections on the suffering caused by global conflicts, urging us to look at ourselves in our local settings... However, one window stands out. It depicts a mother and a father hovering attentively over their newborn child. In this moment, they have found shelter and security, a place of refuge and safety from their struggles. They are together, united in a joyful love, at peace with each other, and resting in the grace that surrounds them.

We all know this scene, even if for some, the gift it represents has become hidden. In the midst of what may be a commercial display, this simple image reminds us of a promise that transcends time and place. Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus are there, inviting us into their lives. Hope springs from this image; peace is at its heart. The Holy Family speaks to us of hope and joy in new life–to each of us in our own local families. The child points us to where peace can be found–especially for the world beyond us.

Here in Melbourne, we await this Christmas knowing far too many are suffering in the throes of war internationally, and struggle at home. As we look to that humble family from Bethlehem, how might we give special attention to how we live with all our brothers and sisters as a holy family? Families, of course, are not always easy places to be, and they require a daily practice of love and self-giving, patience and respect, attentiveness and forgiveness.

As we see the loving gaze of Mary and Joseph on their Child, who is our Saviour, might we lift up a humble prayer, asking that God's love and mercy surround us, and Christ's peace and compassion flourish among us.
