
The Holy Rosary







In Scripture, God speaks directly to us

Jesus speaks to the people of His love for His Children, of prayer as communion with Him and trust in God

Matthew 6:25-35

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

Matthew 7: 7-13

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

"Which of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him! So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.

Mysteries of the Rosary

The Rosary is the story of the New Testament (Jesus' life, death and resurrection). Each decade is recited in honour of a Mystery in Our Lord's life and that of his Blessed Mother who intercedes for us to Him.

Traditionally, the rosary is said with **five decades**, each meditating on a set of Mysteries. A decade consists of **one Our Father** followed by **ten Hail Marys** and concludes with the **Glory Be** and **Fatima prayer** ("O, My Jesus…").

Our Blessed Mother has appeared many times urging us to pray the rosary as a spiritual weapon against evil and to bring peace on earth. With our prayers guided by the Blessed Mother in union with our Lord we can obtain gifts of conversion of hearts and peace on earth.

The order of Mysteries and days traditionally prayed, the whole week a meditation on Jesus' life:






Prayer Intentions

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy Will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.





Concluding prayers:

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, Our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy towards us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Pray for us oh Holy Mother of God. That we be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray, O God, whose only begotten Son, by his life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known, that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly unt thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I comeefore thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.




